We are learning about Titanic because...

We want to **encourage** pupils to be **creative** and **curious** about the world around them.



Key Questions & outcomes:

What happened to the Titanic and when?

The Titanic set sail on its maiden voyage to New York from Southampton on 12th April 1912 and sank off the coast of Canada on 15th April 1912, after hitting an iceberg.

1506 people died on board the Titanic:

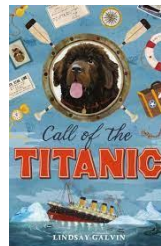
How did your experience vary depending on what class you were in?

1st Class (rich): First class on board the Titanic was the ultimate in luxury. 61% of all first class passengers survived.

3rd Class (poor): Third class was much more basic with very few facilities, but passengers still enjoyed a high level of luxury compared to other liners of the day. 24% of all third class passengers survived.

Major events	Key Dates
The design of the Titanic was approved	29th July 1908
Building of the Titanic began at Harland and Wolfe Shipyard, Belfast, NI	31st March 1909
The hull of the Titanic was successfully launched	31st May 1911
The Titanic is completed	31st March 1912
The Titanic arrives in Southampton	3rd April 1912
The Titanic begins her maiden voyage	10th April 1912
The Titanic reaches Queenstown, Ireland	11th April 1912
The Titanic hits an iceberg	14th April 1912
The Titanic sinks	15th April 1912
